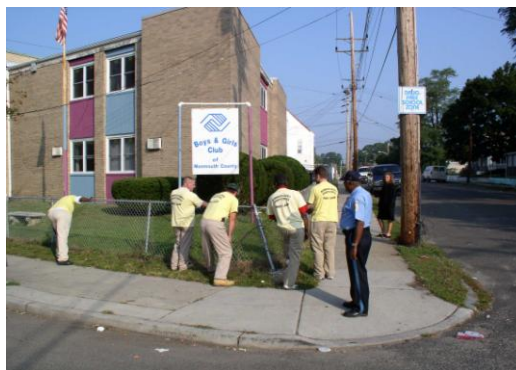

Inmate Labor Programs

In 2003, inmates involved in the Labor Program worked **14,396 hours in 35 municipalities** throughout Monmouth County, resulting in an estimated savings of more than **\$74,139** for taxpayers.



Inmate labor teams have tackled every type of project imaginable:

- Painting
- Restoring
- Landscaping
- Cleaning
- Intensive labor

Participation in the Inmate Labor Program is completely voluntary. Inmates enrolled in the program participate in the work projects as an alternative to spending time in jail. Only offenders incarcerated for minor offenses, with records of good behavior, may be enrolled.

Requests for Inmate Labor teams must be made by municipal Government officials. Work crews are assigned based upon the scale, and feasibility of the project.

Monmouth County Sheriff Shaun Golden's Inmate Labor program has tackled every type of project imaginable, from painting and rough carpentry, to restoring a Civil War era cemetery.



Inmate laborers involved in the voluntary program have assisted the Public Works department of Middletown, cleaned beach debris at a Coast Guard station on Sandy Hook, and restored an historic cemetery and a park in Matawan.
